First, thank you to all those of you who have maintained your giving, by whatever method. For those of you who need to use the US Postal Service for any reason, please ensure that you or your financial institution use our **mailing** address:

Anything addressed to our street address (24 Varsity St.) is given the "side-eye" by the postal service and its arrival is delayed. Boo, hiss. ;)

Second: If your Realm app is misbehaving (displays an Oops! at the top of the screen), it may be because they have made yet another update, and your app needs to "refreshed." To do this, the simplest fix seems to be to open the app, find your way to your Profile page (where you would change your own address, for example) and Sign Out. Then reopen the app and sign back in. This

should fix the bad behavior, as long as your device is set to update apps automatically.

Finally: Consider forcing Amazon to share the wealth during this time of



massive online ordering. If you are an Amazon Prime subscriber, you can choose to select a nonprofit to receive a portion of your purchase costs. When you login to <u>smile.amazon.com</u>, you can select (as shown above) to support UUTC... you will have to use our full name, as shown above. UUTC generally receives enough in proceeds each year to fund a small budget line, and this year those proceeds will be even more important.


