
# How Are You Doing?

These pictures illustrate what Zoom looks like on a computer equipped with a webcam, but using a smartphone is the easiest way to join a zoom meeting. The photos above are from the March Board of Trustees meeting and an early COVID response group meeting. In the second image, you can see the phone icon in the upper right corner for someone who has joined as "audio only."

In preparing to join a Zoom meeting, get a bit of light on your face, find a way to prop up your smartphone so you don't have to hold it steady the whole time, and position it so it is as level with your face as you can get it. This will let others see you clearly and increase your comfort for this online conversation.

You do not need to download an app for Zoom when you are invited to a meeting. Just click on the link at the scheduled time and the magic will start to happen.

The Men's Group, thanks to Mark Allison, Jim Hardy and Dave Roberts, will have their first "Face-toface" via Zoom this coming Tuesday! Gus Napier and others had asked if there was anyway to make this happen, and a Way Was Made.
