Once again, we need to have a "quorum" respond so please fill these ballots out and return to us in the enclosed self addressed stamped envelope by Monday, June 1. We will print the results of this vote in the newsletter on Friday, June 5. A reminder - For the past couple of years, we have offered meetings at UUTC for you to attend to see the proposed budget and ask any questions you may have. We want to continue to give you that option so Dave Roberts (Finance Committee) and Gail Meyers (Treasurer) will host yet another Zoom Budget Meeting on Thursday, May 28 at 7:00pm. Hello Flock!

Someone this week told me I was like a sheepdog—I think their analogy was that I was helping keep the flock together, which I thought was pretty funny. That's because a friend who once had a sheepdog has related to me about the beloved dog's overenthusiastic efforts to herd her and whomever she was with whenever they went to take a walk. So I pictured that dog--tongue hanging out, running



along one side, then the other, getting entangled in the leash, nipping at people's heels, panting, and being a general nuisance-- when I heard the sheepdog comment, LOL!

But I do know that since we shut our doors back in March, I and all of the staff have been reflecting a lot on what we are doing in this time—it can feel a bit like herding—come this way, try this, get on Zoom for that, where is the flock? Are they reading this? Is there anybody out there? Are we doing all we can to BE church in this time? How do we meet our mission to *support individual spiritual journeys and promote social, economic and environmental justice* in this time? We know that UUTC's level of e-communication has necessarily increased in lieu of connecting in person, and we hope it is not a nuisance!

Fortunately, while we know that the pandemic will continue for a while, it is almost summer! Even though we must necessarily be planning for the long haul (as was suggested in last Friday's <u>letter from</u> <u>national UUA President Rev. It is gratifying that so many of you are participating in our Sunday Facebook livestreams and are using Zoom for meetings, getting to know Ministerial Candidate Rev. Bob Renjilian, and connecting with others for book clubs and social gatherings. While we know that using the screen to connect is not nearly the same as being in-person, how wonderful that we do have that!

As people of faith, we are called to connect with each other and the world. In that light, what if we saw taking it upon ourselves to learn the technology as a spiritual quest? As UUTC administrator RK Young said this week, "Tech tools are familiar because we make them familiar." So, if you've tried and failed, or not tried yet, to connect using Zoom (or other platform), let me encourage you to get back on that pony—you might surprise yourself. While you may not grow to love it, you can become more conversant, and that has its rewards.

This week, when I met with the LHHH team we had 7 people sharing on-screen and a couple of others who were part of the audio feed—up from just a few weeks ago, when only 2 people managed it! I can't tell you how it fed my soul to get to be in the presence of these caring people at this time. 

Text Giving — Easier Than You Think

Giving via text message is a way of giving with a smart phone that doesn't even need a special app.





Once you've selected all the options you

like, hit continue. At that point you'll be asked to put in your payment method.

And you're done! You are now an official Text Giving Wizard! The next time, you won't even have to fill out the payment method!

Start by opening/creating a new text message. For **To:** use **73256**.

Then type in **UUTC \$** and add whatever amount you would like to give beside the dollar sign.

When you hit send, a message pops up that takes you to the giving menu.
