

able to get together in person again but want to help keep the number of COVID-19 cases down and keep all of our members and friends safe. After much discussion and consideration, it was decided it is best to keep the UUTC building closed through the month of July. We will, of course, continue to be working "outside" of the building and will continue with services via Facebook live. We will continue to monitor the COVID-19 situation and make adjustments as necessary.

We are moving forward in preparing our official mail-in ballots for both the Annual Congregational Meeting and the Settled Minister Candidate. These will come to you in two separate mailings, both of which will have a self-addressed stamped envelope for you to easily return your ballot. The definition of a quorum is "the minimum number of members of an assembly or society that must be present at any of its meetings to make the proceedings of that meeting valid." Even though we can not be present together at this time, we feel it is **essential to hear your voices** on these UUTC matters. We will be

requiring that we receive mailed ballots equal to or above our normal "quorum" in order for it to be a valid vote. How about 100%? That would nicely meet quorum!

Members will receive the official ballot to call Rev. Bob Renjilian as Settled Minister first. It will be mailed out on Friday, May 15. We ask that you watch the services that Rev. Bob will be conducting both on May 17 and 24 and attend a Zoom session to get to know him a little better. Then please vote after the service on the 24th and mail back in ASAP. We need these ballots back in to UUTC by Friday, May 29 so that we may tally them and let you know the outcome during the Sunday service held on May 31st. PLEASE fill these out and mail back in as soon as you can!

On Thursday, May 21 we will mail the official ballot to vote for the 2020-21 UUTC Board of Trustees, Nominations Committee and 2020-21 Annual Budget. Once again, we need to have a "quorum" respond so please fill these ballots out and return to us by Friday, May 29. We will print the results of this vote in the newsletter on Friday, June 5.

A reminder - For the past couple of years, we have offered meetings at UUTC for you to attend to see the proposed budget and ask any questions you may have. We want to continue to give you that option so Dave Roberts (Finance Committee) and Gail Meyers (Treasurer) will host two Zoom Budget Meetings. These are scheduled to be on Wednesday, May 20 at 10:00am and Thursday, May 28 at 7:00pm. Remember that you can dial in with just a phone to ask questions and be answered. That number will be sent to you in the notification.

As I have been stating, I realize this is all a little different than we planned, and I ask for your patience as we try to move forward as accountably we can. If you have any questions, please reach out to me at joyce.henneberry@gmail.com. We will get through this all!

Light to Connect Us—The Chalice Project

It's Spring. Want to play in the Mud?

We are making ceramic chalices. They will be unglazed stoneware, which makes them impervious to water (or wax, or flame). They will not be large. Any child and nearly any adult will be able to create a successful form for the cradling of a tea light. Once fired, a twilight lighting will be staged and filmed so that we can all enjoy the glow. We have tentatively scheduled this ceremony for June 21st.



To begin, you must follow the link at the end of this article and let us know if you a) want to participate, b) can pick up clay from the church sidewalk, and c) have more than one person in your household who wants to play. This link will collect the necessary information we need to prepare adequate clay for pickup. Select a date from the form that comes up that tells us which day you will

arrive at the church to pick up your clay. If you do not have Internet, please email <u>eloise@uutc.org</u> — she will take care of the rest!

Two days after you complete your chalice, it must be delivered back to UUTC, before it gets too dry and fragile. Place your work inside the Vestibule on the walnut shelf— we will ready them for delivery to Mud Dabbers. The pieces will be fired after all are collected. However, we are opening up this project to our larger community, and with a date set for the ceremony, please feel free to invite your friends to take part in the project!

Due to the nature of this project, the work will not be glazed (though it could be in the future if you wished to make an arrangement with Mud Dabbers or Brevard Clay). When the pieces are completely fired, we will pick them up, load them with tea lights, and have a livestream ceremony that will be made available as a video on our website for those who cannot attend the Facebook livestream. **Fear Not.** Margaret Kimble's video instruction is superb and is included in the link below!
