We had 167 ballots returned with a 99% "Yes" vote to call Rev. Bob Renjilian to be our settled minister! Rev. Renjilian has accepted and will begin with UUTC as of August 1!

We had 147 ballots returned for our Annual Meeting. The vote for Board of Trustees and Nominations Committee was a unanimous "Yes!" UUTC's 2020-21 Board of Trustees, beginning July 1 are as follows: Susan Zelle, President; Bart Renner, President-Elect; Gail Meyers, Treasurer; Kay Webb, Secretary; Betty Kendrick, Elizabeth Williams and Tom Stanwood Members At Large. The 2020-21 Nominations Committee consists of Cantey Carpenter, Jim Hardy and Peter Mockridge.

The 2020-21 Budget also passed with 145 "Yes" and 2 Abstained.

This was an unusual way to hold our Annual Meeting this year - I appreciate you all participating and returning your ballots by the deadlines.

The Back Pack Buddies Program provides food packs on Friday afternoons to students who are in extreme need situations and are likely to have inadequate food for the weekend.

School year 2020-21 is the 14th year for Back Pack Buddies in Transylvania County Schools. This year the program will be sponsored through the efforts of Manna Food Bank, Change the World Relief Organization, local churches, fire departments and many individuals.

During the school year, the program delivers an average of 250 packs per week. During the summer, that number drops slightly, to about 180. No data is yet available for the number served this year as a result of COVID, but we know the need is increasing. Please give generously!
