
#### Our new phone number to reach the office is 828-435-2781.

Please put this number into your phone contacts for "UUTC Office" or write it into your phone book. (The old phone number is gone.) Your call will be answered initially by a regular "Greeting," and then will transfer to ring on the office phone and to me remotely. There will be regular times when I will be monitoring the phone and answering in person. At other times I will check periodically for messages and will get back to you or pass along your message to the appropriate person. Times are subject to tweaking, but initially the phone will be directly monitored Monday, Wednesday and Thursday from 12 noon till 3 pm. If your call is not answered, you will get a call back.

Please note that phone messages are converted to email text so I can check messages easily at other times and direct messages to the correct person. So please be sure to leave your name (first and last) clearly with your message. However, you don't have to leave your phone number unless you prefer to get a call back on a different number. The new system is a little bit different, but so are these remotework times. The goal is to make sure we can all keep in touch in a timely fashion, so when you need to call the office, try it out. # **UU Summer Camp: Virtually SUUSI!**

Virtual SUUSI will happen from July 18-25, the same week we planned for in-person SUUSI. Have you ever wanted SUUSI to be longer? This year everyone is Early Arrival! We will officially start SUUSI on Saturday, July 18. (Or earlier – there will be a preview/dress rehearsal event on Friday evening to help everyone figure out the tech.)



We're still building our scaled-down schedule. You can expect worship, <u>concert hour</u>, age group programming, workshops, sports and games activities, small group discussions, nature experiences, <u>cabaret</u>, and even a dance option. We'll have virtual versions of our sacred SUUSI traditions, including ingathering, the Transitions worship service, Teen Way Off Broadway, and closing circle.

Teens should know that we're planning to have teen touch groups, as well as other key teen programs like coffeehouse, <u>TWOB</u>, and bridging.

Middlers can expect special Coming of Age activities for 13-year-olds, plus a Middler dance and some virtual activities we call Options.

There will be no charge to attend Virtual SUUSI 2020 – not even for workshops. Your staff are all donating their time. Nonetheless, SUUSI will have expenses this year, and there will be opportunities for you to donate to cover those costs. We are hopeful that the generosity of our community will more than cover these expenses, and the Board will be able to dedicate funds to other causes. We are keenly aware of the impact that COVID-19 has had on our SUUSI community and the greater WCU and Sylva communities to which we are so closely tied. Beyond our traditional SUUSIship and Endowment fundraising efforts, we feel there are opportunities to assist those communities while the crisis continues.

# **Privacy Protection and Your Pledge**


Once upon a time, in this trusting, wonderful congregation, you were able to give your financial information to the Treasurer and he or she would set up your automatic giving for you. If your credit card expiration date changed, he or she would update that record. Life being what it is world wide, software companies all over the globe are shutting "back doors" to data. This now impacts UUTC.


While the Admin and the Treasurer can verify that your giving has been recorded properly and generate reports for you, we are no longer able to enter or modify your actual financial account data. This is actually a good practice, because it protects you from bad actors. Not every employee everywhere is ethical, which is why the software companies are making these changes.

If you have participated in any of the online giving links ("Give Now," "Operation Cupcake," text giving, etc.), then you have already had practice in these next steps. AND, if you prefer to write checks, you can of course continue to mail those in. But for those of us who like to set it and forget it, we need to use the Realm online giving menus and get it done before July 1st. Let's start with a shortcut to the

Give button on the UUTC website.

When you click the pink text above, you will get this menu. To open the submenu that you see here, click on the little triangle to the right of where it says "Operating Gift." From there, select "Pledge."





Now select a date when you wish your gift to be deposited in the UUTC account. This image shows the 5th of July highlighted (ever so slightly— I realize these menus were designed for younger eyes!) as the day of the month on which your pledge would hit the bank. Using the 1st or the 15th is preferred, if it doesn't make a big difference to you... doing so results in easier accounting for deposits.

Next, you would **select "Give Multiple Times"** to set up a once

week, every two weeks, once a

month, or an every three months schedule of periodic giving.

Finally, enter the amount of your gift (where the illustration shows \$50). Then click CONTINUE.

The next step is where you enter your financial account information for the account from which you want your gift drawn. This may differ from the account which you may use for charitable giving. So if you need to "add another account," that is an option.

IF, like myself, you may have forgotten what you wrote on that pledge form so long ago, reach out to your Treasurer, Gail Meyers. She can easily pull up this information from the pledge drive forms or from within Realm. Her contact email is on page 5.

Finally, if you have trouble logging into Realm, contact me or Eloise. We can reissue an invitation so that you can get properly logged into Realm and join the party going on in there. ;) Thanks for your generous support!
