
SPIRITUAL EXPLORERS

Artists in Pursuit of Meaning




March 2nd, 6:30pm

Artists in Pursuit of Meaning has been conceived as a three-session course, with the first two featuring movies on a couple of artists: Andy Goldsworthy and Maya Lin. "Art for me is a form of nourishment," Goldsworthy says. And many of you have probably experienced at least one of Maya Lin's great works: the Vietnam Memorial. Both of these artists create deeply spiritual experiences for observers of their work. While Goldsworthy's work is very personal expression, Maya Lin was focused on a redeeming work for the families of survivors. Both of these journeys are good films, lasting around 90 minutes each.

The first two classes will jump right into the films (via Zoom screensharing). Even if you have seen these films before, you are encouraged to re-watch these with the group so that they will be fresh in your mind for the discussion topics afterwards.

Andy Goldworthy's work is very personal, and can provide insight into the exploration necessary to build a personal vision of expression. Maya Lin, on the other



hand, is a visionary artist who suffered through quite a trial in the crafting of her most-known work: The Vietnam Memorial in Washington, DC.

These two artists can give us insight into how we can learn to communicate our own personal, and our communal messages through the mediums of our choice. The third class will introduce a project which you can choose to participate in which will give you a chance to practice building your personal and visional expression.

This class is appropriate for teens of high school age and up. There is some content that is sensually derived, and other content that is violent and infuriating. Both films are documentaries.
