# CHARITABLE GIVING FOR JULY: MINISTERIAL DISCRETIONARY FUND

#### A Change in Execution

Starting this month, all Charitable Giving contributions will go into a separate fund prior to dispersal. Therefore, checks should be written TO UUTC, with the agency designation on the memo line.

This will allow your checks to clear almost immediately, making balancing your checkbook less of an issue. It also guarantees that you can deduct your contribution to the designated cause. UUTC will then write one check to the agency, or in this case, fund, and we will not have dozens of checks sitting around waiting for an agency to collect.

#### **Ministerial Discretionary Fund**

In the past year, our minister has given funds to help purchase medications, pay for



overnight housing, assist with utility bills and a few other needs. Sometimes these gifts support those at UUTC, and sometimes they support others in the community. Your gifts this month will refill this reservoir for Rev. Ilene to use in ministering to the needs of our personal and connected community.

This is an opportunity to give, not an obligation.

# FIFTH SUNDAY COLLECTION

July is a month with FIVE Sundays, so UUTC will be collecting food for Sharing House at the end of the month. Baskets will be available in the lobby for your donations on July 23 and 30. Please take with you a list of most needed items from the basket on the counter.



# SPONSORED PROJECTS 2017-2018

Great things happened (and are still happening!) in 2016-2017 with your generous donations. Estimates are in for some serious wishes for our new fiscal year. Scheduling will be determined as donations are turned in to the Treasurer or placed in the donations box on the office counter. While the list below is not complete, it should provide a clue to the projects that are of high priority this year. Bold print items are particularly high priority.

**Nursery**—1. Recessed shelving - \$1,625.00 2. Flooring—\$1386.70. Space creation and easy to clean flooring for our little ones and nursery staff.

Small Classroom—Magnetic White Board— \$1400.00 Wall-size whiteboard to allow easy display of creations by children, and the flexibility to quickly remove artwork in favor of some other use when necessary. Full-wall curtain to cover the whiteboard



The old florescent fixture is gone, replaced with recessed LED lighting. The suspension ceiling is gone, too. What will be in place on Sunday?

when a covenant circle meets—undetermined cost at this time.

A big emphasis for this year is to begin dealing with the failing florescent fixtures that we inherited. Replacing ballasts costs as much (or more) that replacing fixtures, and where it currently appears we have "dead bulbs" is actually the result of dying ballasts. LED fixtures provide us with the flexibility of dimmable fixtures, and the light from LED fixtures is much healthier for those who work in the building (like our new minister!). They also, of course, cost less to operate. LED Lighting for Classrooms & Nursery—\$1718. LED Lighting for **Minister's Office, CRE Office + Men's Room Sensor**—\$1236. Social Hall & Foyer—TBD.

An audio professional will be coming to UUTC next week to consult with us on how to add microphones over the choir area—we hope to have this cost available soon.

Other projects: Replacement of 3 Hearing Assist Devices—\$360.00, removal of 22 White Pines— \$1925.00, mulch for Varsity, 20 yards delivered—\$656.51. Choir chairs with book racks —\$1200. Pressure-washing of sidewalks & soffits — \$500.
