

Mountain Neighbors Network of Brevard is proud to announce that renowned surgeon, public health researcher and writer Dr. Atul Gawande will be the guest speaker on Monday, September 25, 2017 at the 15th Celebration of the founding of Beacon Hill Village and the subsequent Village Movement their innovative model inspired. The conversation, entitled "Being Mortal's Villages: The Value of Community and Choice as we Grow Older," will be moderated by Robin Young, host of NPR's Hear & Now, and feature a discussion on aging, living life with purpose, and how we can transform the possibilities for the later chapter's in everyone's lives.

Mountain Neighbors Network is Transylvania County's local Village, a

nonprofit volunteer-based member of the national Village-to-Village network, focused on providing a variety of services that address the social and physical needs of those who are 60 years of age and over so that they can live independently in their own homes for as long as possible. The organization's intent is to fill the gaps and not duplicate services that are already available from other Transylvania County service providers.

The event on September 25th will begin at 5:00 PM in the Fellowship Hall of the Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd located at 22 Fisher Road in Brevard. It will be simulcast from Boston to more than 150 of the 350-plus Villages open and in development across the country, including Mountain Neighbors Network. DARK WEB SCANNING — DO THIS NOW



Most are aware that a hack of the Equifax credit reporting company occurred in May of this year but has come to light only recently. Nearly all US residents have been impacted. One of the first things

you can do to protect yourself is to find out whether your email address (or addresses) has been compromised in any way. While <u>requesting credit reports</u> from all three credit reporting companies (Equifax, TransUnion and Experian) is **a necessary** (**FREE**) step, these reports may not indicate whether you've been compromised at this time.

For a Dark Web Email Scan, <u>follow this LINK</u>, and conduct a scan for each email address you have. Once the report is delivered to your email, open it and see if there were any "positive" results positive as in they found Dark Web activity. *If they did, then any online accounts you have that use that email as a login are more readily compromised*. We would recommend that you establish a new email address and then go to those accounts and change your login.

If you are forced to change your email address, please be sure and let UUTC know so that we can update your records and ensure that you will not have an interruption in newsletter or statement delivery. For more steps you can take, check this step-by-step guide from <u>CNET</u>.

CHARITABLE GIVING FOR SEPT: PISGAH LEGAL SERVICES

Pisgah Legal Services is a community-based non-profit law firm providing free civil legal help to our communities' most vulnerable: the working poor, the elderly, the disabled, and victims of abuse. In 2016, Pisgah Legal prevented homelessness and stabilized housing for 2,967 people in WNC. They are the only free legal resource in Western North Carolina.

Thursday, September 28, Pisgah Legal Services, together with Asheville Area Habitat for Humanity, Homeward Bound and Mountain Housing Opportunities are hosting an evening with Matthew Desmond, the keynote speaker for **Pisgah Legal's 7th Annual Poverty Forum**. Desmond is a professor of sociology at Princeton University. His book, *Evicted*, won the 2017 Pulitzer Prize for nonfiction, among many other awards.
