

BOARD SUMMARY, OCTOBER • CAROL MOORE

Your delinquent President is just now getting around to summarizing the October 2017 Board meeting. Forgive her, please.

In October, **Rev. Ilene** highlighted her many meetings with staff members, ministry teams, individual congregants, and those in the wider community. She shared plans to attend the UUA Ministerial Fellowshipping Committee

in late November, plans for our December Christmas Eve services, and developing ideas for her formal installation in April.

Dave Roberts, Treasurer, reported that he has an appointment with Terry Andersen on November 7 to discuss the scope and timing of an outside financial review of UUTC's finances. He also reported that pledge giving was down in September and advised that we watch the trend for the next few months.

The **Administration Committee** was commended for its work on clarifying policy statements in our Policy Manual; developing policy suggestions related to our website environment; and looking ahead to the need for a strategic planning initiative.

Highlights from the **Finance Committee** report included suggestions for introducing the "Wake Now Our Vision Legacy Challenge"; temporarily putting Chalice Lighter recruitment on hold; recommendations concerning the underpayment of pledges, should the trend continue; a proposal to fund "Muffins with the Minister"; and recommendations regarding #52 Varsity house. (A generous donor offered to fund "Muffins with the Minister" for the next 12 months, so that item was not added to our operational budget.)

There was no report from the **Property Committee**. Brigid, Board liaison to the Committee, Property, reported that it is working on parking issues and memorial garden policy recommendations.

Rev. Ilene reported that **Advisory Council** member Susan Slocum is investigating leadership recruitment and training

materials for the Council. She also reported that the Council is discussing the continued need for a Hospitality/Fellowship Team to coordinate various fellowship activities at UUTC.

Discussion about Stewardship: There was consensus that a year-round Stewardship Team needs to replace the annual pledge drive Task Force. The Board's President-Elect will serve as Board liaison to the Stewardship Team, and the Team should include the UUTC Treasurer and a member from the Finance Committee.

The **Board Calendar Review** included reports that: Treasurer Dave Roberts has obtained the Application for Tax-Exempt Status Form, due before the end of January; the Board Secretary has filed our annual application to the County Commission for use of parking lots; a Facilities Team leader will update our snow removal contract; and the Board Secretary will update our Cancellation Notification Plan.

A memo from the **Facilities Team** made some recommendations regarding #52 Varsity (blue) and #46 Varsity (yellow) properties. Because Board members and others were scheduled to watch a the UU MidAmerica Region Webinar on Stewardship, discussion of the Varsity properties was tabled until November and the meeting adjourned.



Contact Directories are really important for us all to stay connected. But did you know that the **ChurchLife** app is available to Members? It is easy

to use and is the most up-to-date resource for reaching other Members and Friends of UUTC.

You can download and install the app from either Google Play or the Apple App Store. Before you can use it, however, you will need a password from our ACS database.

To get that password, go to our Member page on the website: http://uutc.org/member/, scroll down to the red "ACS" logo and click on it. It will direct you to the ACS login/get a password page. On that page, look below the login box for "Need a Password," and

enter your email there. This will connect you to ACS and they will email you with a way to select a password to use with the *ChurchLife* app.

Depending on Member or Friend information, you will be able to get directions to their home, call, email or text directly from within the app.

HELPING EMPLOYEES KEEP TIME... AND BOOKKEEPERS TO RECORD IT



At the Sept. Board meeting, the addition of a payroll time clock was discussed and approved. Currently, our 18 employees track time on paper time sheets, which our bookkeeper Sue Gervais uses to input time data before the accounting software can complete the payroll. Occasionally, time sheets are misplaced and RK makes calls until the necessary information is found.

Our new time clock, generously subsidized by a Member of the congregation, uses PIN numbers to allow employees to clock in and out, in addition to tracking their time. Use will go into full effect in January.
