A WELCOMING CONGREGATION

A MESSAGE FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

We are thrilled with the wonderful response of Members and Friends to our newly-formed Stewardship Team's 2018-2019 fiscal year pledge drive. Pledge amounts are up, and we are seeing many financial commitments from first-time pledgers, too! What a blessing.

While pledge amounts for the next fiscal year are excellent and will provide a strong foundation for UUTC's budget, we also need to make sure that none of the financial commitments made for the current fiscal year slip our minds! While we probably all agree that our "covenantal relationship" as Unitarian Universalists provides us tremendous freedom from creeds and a set dogma, this covenant does carry some responsibility. As members, our word is our bond to one another. When the budget is established each year and approved by congregational vote (which happens each year at our Annual Congregational meeting—May 20 this year!), the projected revenues determine salaries, services, and which programs can be fully implemented. The projected revenues are based primarily on our personal pledges to UUTC. Our monthly financial reports indicate how faithful we are in fulfilling those pledges. And, for many of us, there are times in which we need to be reminded of the importance of fulfilling those pledges.

Currently, the actual revenue for the current fiscal year is falling behind the pledged income by approximately \$29,000.00. The Finance Committee is asking everyone to ensure that they make every attempt to fulfill their 2017-2018 annual pledges this fiscal year so that UUTC does not experience a shortfall at the end of the fiscal year (which ends June 30, 2018.) Our Committee is hoping to see the fulfillment of these remaining pledged funds in the next 90 days, helping to minimize the deficit. If there are circumstances which prohibit you from fully funding the pledge you made at this time last year, please contact Dave Roberts, Treasurer, or Rev. Ilene, so that adjustments can be made to the budget. Your response would be greatly appreciated.

Board members will greet and usher; John Austin and the choir, as well as the Eclectics, will deliver some very fine music; Bill Kimzey will provide flowers; local clergy will process; the Rev. Dr. Kate Walker, from Rev. Ilene's home church, will preach; the offering will support three charities. Y'all come!

Getting Closer to Razing the Blue House

As reported earlier, in November the Board unanimously decided to raze the blue house as funds became available. With generous gifts from several members of the congregation, we now have \$5,200 toward the \$7000 needed to proceed. That would cover removal, a civil engineering study of drainage issues, and minimal landscaping. Once we have secured the funds, we can arrange for the Brevard Fire Department to conduct a housefire training exercise to accomplish the removal. *I would personally be thrilled if UUTC were to receive enough additional contributions to go ahead with this project as soon as possible. Please help if you can.*

Recent Membership Class

The March 24 Membership Class included 14 prospective members. Those who choose to join the congregation at this time will enjoy a new member reception to be held on Sunday, April 8.

Stewardship News

Thanks to the Stewardship Team for its efforts in this year's pledge campaign, and its plans to fundraise in the remainder of the year. At the time of the March Board meeting, UUTC had received 68 pledges for 2018-2019, for a total pledge amount of \$149,415. As of this writing, we have received 82 pledges for a total of \$164,723. Thank you – and let's keep those remaining pledges rolling in!

New Financial Practice

An outside financial review by Terry Andersen was completed on February 28. An industry "best practices" recommendation included to keep the counting room door locked on Sundays when the offering is being counted (to prevent distractions) and to have it counted by two people who are not a couple. If ushers serving **are** a couple, they can grab the nearest volunteer to help count, who should sign the form. This is for the protection of both the church and couples who have done it jointly in the past. This new practice is NOT a response to any error by any usher; it is simply best practice.

Leadership and Staffing

Lisa Sheffield has been approved as a new member of the Property Committee. Thank you, Lisa! The Social Justice and Loving Hearts Teams are fully staffed and thriving. But the Stewardship Team needs two additional members, and UUTC needs to form Fellowship, Personnel, and Strategic Planning Teams. We also still have open positions on the Advisory Council and the Board for 2018-19. *Please give thoughtful and prayerful consideration to filling a needed role. Together we carry on the ministry of this church.*

Rental Property Boundaries

Members from the Property Committee and the Facilities Team have determined lot boundaries for the two Varsity rental properties. (These are informal boundaries for our use, not formal or legal boundaries.) We are using bricks already available to establish boundary lines that will be visible to tenants but will allow Hector to easily mow the grass. Shrubs and/or fencing may be considered at a future time.

Annual Meeting and Budget Forums

Mark your calendars! Our **Annual Meeting** to elect officers and adopt a budget will be held after the second worship service on **Sunday**, **May 20**. Budget forums to explain the proposed budget and answer questions will be held at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 3 and at 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, May 5.

Shared Pulpit

On five different Sundays, one in April and four in July, you can look forward to hearing Alex Burroughs, Kristin Leesment, Carol Moore, Susan Sklar, and Michael Solomon share the sermons they wrote in connection with their Shared Pulpit experience last fall. Carol Flake, course facilitator, has generously agreed to facilitate the course again next fall.


Memorial Garden Policy

IF YOU ARE A MEMBER, THE BEST DIRECTORY IS ON YOUR SMARTPHONE

Contact Directories are really important for us all to stay connected. But did you know that the ChurchLife app is

available to Members? It is easy to use and is the most up-to-date resource for reaching other Members and Friends of UUTC.

You can download and install the app from either Google Play or the Apple App Store. Before you can use it, however, you will need a password from our ACS database.

To get that password, go to our Member page on the website: http://uutc.org/member/, scroll down to the red "ACS" logo and click on it. It will direct you to the ACS

login/get a password page. On that page, look below the login box for "Need a Password," and enter your email there. This will connect you to ACS and they will email you with a way to select a password to use with the *ChurchLife* app.

If you do not receive an email from Access ACS/UUTC within a few hours, and you use Comporium email, call Comporium Tech Support and ask them to release this email from your Spam folder. Since the email does not look like our "usual," they assume that it's bad stuff and are trying to protect you. They will ask you to verify the last four digits of your SSN to make sure you are you, and they can fix this very quickly. Then you can complete the password process and start connecting!

TREASURER'S REPORT TO THE CONGREGATION • FEBRUARY, 2018

Dear Friends and Members,

We are currently experiencing a shortfall in income of \$29,618.70; most of this is a difference in pledge income received from what was promised during the campaign last year. Pledge income is over 70% of our total revenue, and we depend on it being donated as was promised to pay our bills.

Please check your records, and if you're behind, catch up as soon as possible. Reverend llene is available to discuss any life situation you may be experiencing, and I also am available to discuss any discrepancy between our records and yours.

Can I make changes to my pledge?

Yes; to do so you should contact UUTC's treasurer Dave Roberts at <u>treasurer@uutc.org</u> or at 610-751-6309.

Does all the money I give to the church count against my pledge commitment?

No; only pledge payments count against a pledge commitment. Other money given for charitable contributions, plate donations, donations to the Dignity Project, Varsity Fund, or Sponsored Projects, etc. does not. Notes for cash or the check memo line should be used to annotate payments you desire to apply to your pledge.

What happens to unpaid pledge commitments at the end of the church year?

Each church year ends on 30 June. In early to mid-June, the church sends out a pledge status to each pledge unit, conducts follow ups with people who have not fully paid their pledge and adjusts pledges per the feedback received.

- . If someone states that some or all the amount owed will not be paid, their pledge is adjusted accordingly
- If no feedback is received, future payments are applied to the unpaid pledge commitment until it is fully paid off.

GLOBAL ART PROJECT FOR PEACE Katherine Somelofski

What words come to mind when you describe Global Peace? UUTC 4-12 year-olds brainstormed their ideas as they began UUTC's contribution to the 2018 Global Art Project for Peace -- A Book of Visions of Global Peace. But first, what is The Global Art Project?

The mission of The Global Art Project is to joyously create a culture of peace through art. Every other year, groups and individuals use their visions of peace to inspire the creation of works of art (visual, word, performance ...). Participants are matched with another group or individual somewhere else in the world to whom they send their work of art. The sharing takes place in the same week resulting in thousands of people sending messages of Peace around the world at one time -- visions of unity simultaneously encircle the Earth. **Our partner congregation is in Bulgaria**.

Ideas flowed as the UUTC youth brainstormed what peace meant to them -- freedom, equality, harmony with the earth and each other, less competition, no trash, swimming ... and more. Then each youngster created their page for the book with the word(s) of their choice and their own work of art. Many incorporated prints of their hand symbolizing that Peace Is In Our Hands. They signed the page and indicated their age.

Thus began the UUTC book of Visions of Peace. The book will be on display during the first 3 weeks of April on the counter next to the nametag boxes.

NOW IT'S YOUR TURN! Everyone is invited to add a page to the book. Blank pages for you to use are with the book. Be creative -- write a poem, draw a picture, create a collage, make your own handprint -- whatever your vision inspires. Sign your page (age optional).

Feel free to take your page home to work on it. Just be sure to have it back in the book by April 22.

ESTABLISHING A DIVERSITY FOREST

The question of the Memorial Garden has been answered—there will be more trees!

After considering a couple of options, the opinion of the Aesthetics arm of the Facilities Team was that every Member, with this precedent established, would prefer to be represented as a leaf on a tree. Other symbology was therefore discarded as a solution. However, knowing

that the creators of our trees may differ, and knowing that as a congregation we celebrate diversity, Aesthetics has recommended that a new tree be commissioned, with additional trees to be acquired as needed. New trees should not replicate the original.

SOCIAL ACTION AGENCY FOR APRIL - S.A.F.E.

The Children's Center of Transylvania County (CCTC) grew out of concern of a group of local community members who felt that abused children should be represented by an organization whose sole function was to advocate for these children. So for over 25 years, The Children's Center has been advocating for abused and neglected children.

CCTC conducts the "Baby, Think It Over" program, the Nurturing Program, and others. The Nurturing Program matches trained volunteers and mentors to provide skills to help manage children without turning to violent methods.
