## LAST CALL FOR JUSTICE LEADERSHIP TRAINING

UUTC has been invited to join a NEW justice leadership training program organized by the [Sacred Fire Unitarian Universalist Ministry](#). **Now more than ever we need capable, deeply-rooted, and effective congregational social justice leadership.** Six areas – western NC, central NC, eastern NC, Texas, Virginia, and the District of Columbia – were chosen for the pilot program.

We are seeking a group of 5-9 UUTC members who will bolster the ongoing work of our congregation, and help launch new initiatives for our justice mission. The group will meet at UUTC twice a month from September 2018 to May 2019 for guided sessions, and participate in two weekend workshops (a fall one in the Charlotte area, and a second one in winter/spring).

In order to ensure that congregations of all sizes and means can participate in the program, it is heavily subsidized by the generosity of donors, foundations, and our UU institutions. Our commitment as a congregation is to hold two worship offerings during the year to help support the program. 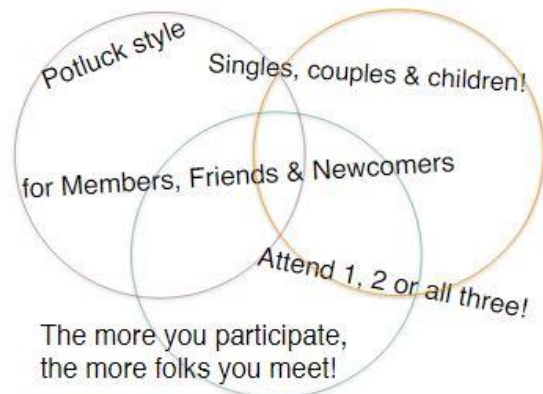

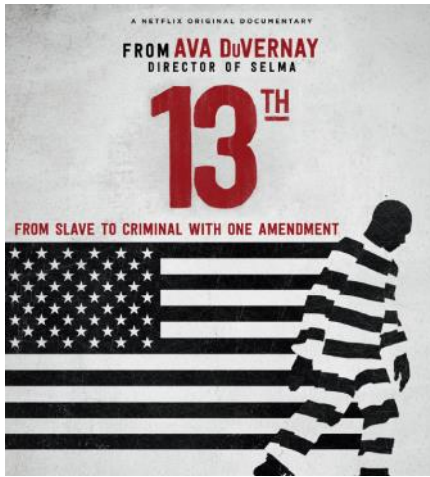

## 13TH — IMPORTANT DOCUMENTARY

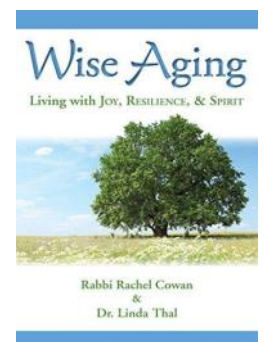

## STARTING SEPTEMBER 11TH: AGING WISELY BOOK STUDY

Aging is not a choice. Aging wisely is. This is an invitation to join Don and Linda Lander and a group of your fellow UUs in community and share your journey as you pursue the goal of aging wisely. We will read the book *Aging Wisely* by Rabbi Rachel Cowan and Dr. Linda Thal as a guide.



From the book: "If the opportunity arises, consider forming your own group of friends and others who are wrestling with these matters, for spiritual work often flourishes best when supported by community."

The course is designed to create this kind of supportive community. To that end the group will adopt a covenant, an agreement as to how we will conduct ourselves in the group. Most importantly the covenant includes: Extending and presuming welcome. Listening actively without judgment. No interrupting, fixing or advice giving. Everyone will have the chance to share as deeply as they wish and it is not "share or die." Confidentiality will be maintained. Members are asked to share their own truth and experience.

The book contains many "Reflection Questions." Answering these questions from our own experience will keep the sharing of the group on topic. The book also contains exercises and help in establishing a spiritual practice.

## STILL COLLECTING SCHOOL SUPPLIES **FIX IT: HEALTHCARE AT THE TIPPING POINT**

**September 20th, 2018 — 6:30-8:00pm at UUTC**

The collection box in the front office is still accepting school supplies for both El Centro and for Sharing House. Items that break down quickly or get used up quickly are most essential. You can never donate too many good pencils!

Other high-need items are the marble composition books that are used for practicing writing, two-pocket folders (with no design on them), 16 or 24-count crayons, wide-rule notebook paper and both school glue and Elmer's glue sticks.

Remember your own childhood—do you remember the smell of a fresh box of crayons? Didn't a brand new notebook make you want to write?

FIX IT: Healthcare at the Tipping Point will be shown, comments given by Marsha Fretwell MD, and a discussion facilitated by Kyra Moore and Dr. Fretwell. The documentary reaches across the political and ideological divide and makes the case for business leaders to support major healthcare reform. The system, as is, is inefficient, has limited accessibility and is cost prohibitive to business and families. Is Medicare for all as a single payer system the solution? This event is sponsored by Healthcare for All, Physicians for a National Health Program and the Transylvania Branch of the NAACP.
