
attorneys, landlords, and businesses (no medical appointments); Information and referrals specific to the Latino community.

STARTING SEPTEMBER 11TH: AGING WISELY BOOK STUDY

Aging is not a choice. Aging wisely is. This is an invitation to join Don and Linda Lander and a group of your fellow UUs in community and share your journey as you pursue the goal of aging wisely. We will read the book *Aging Wisely* by Rabbi Rachel Cowan and Dr. Linda Thal as a guide.

From the book: "If the opportunity arises, consider forming your own group of friends and others who are wrestling with these matters, for spiritual work often flourishes best when supported by community." The course is designed to

create this kind of supportive community. To that end the group will adopt a covenant. Most importantly the covenant includes: Extending and presuming welcome. Listening actively without judgment. No interrupting, fixing or advice giving. Everyone will have the chance to share as deeply as they wish and it is not "share or die." Confidentiality will be maintained. Members are asked to share their own truth and experience.

The book contains many "Reflection Questions." Answering these questions from our own experience will keep the sharing of the group on topic. The book also contains exercises and help in establishing a spiritual practice. The Aging Wisely group will meet every Tuesday, except for holidays, from 3:00 to 5:00PM at the church starting on September 11. THE TEAM ISSUE — WHO & WHAT

Teams do the work of UUTC. They are the people who like "hands on" work, in support of the Mission of UUTC—to support individual spiritual journeys and to promote social, economic and environmental justice. Teams make the Mission happen and report to the Minister.

Team Leaders rotate off their Team for at least one year after a period of 3 years of service.

STARTING WITH A RECENT WOW — WORSHIP TEAM

Recent development: implementation of the Shared Pulpit program—a half-year course of study and writing with other members and friends of UUTC in crafting a personal story into a full-length sermon. In this first cohort, all chose to share their sermons with the congregation, providing a rich connection for all who attended.

While the Worship Team's Function statement doesn't specifically address individual spiritual journeys—a definite development of participation in the Shared Pulpit course—that component of the UUTC Mission is a natural alignment to their original Function Statement.

Every imaginable impact on the success of UUTC's worship services, year round, is touched by the Worship Team. Copyright permissions from speakers, matches for lighting the chalice, coordinating the Order of Service, providing for submissions to the Transylvania Times each week, working with John Austin, Carlene Ragan and the choir—there are many, many little pieces that come together to make worship at UUTC relevant for the greatest range of spiritual seekers in Transylvania County.

The Worship Team is assisted in meeting the extensions of their Function by the Affiliated Roles of Usher Coordinator (Gypsy & Kristin), the Shared Pulpit Facilitator (Carol F.), all those who *serve* as ushers, all those who serve in the music ministry (choir, Eclectics) and the writer of our Church News (Carol Moore).

SOCIAL ACTION — REACHING OUTSIDE OUR DOORS FOR IMPACT

Function: Work with the Minister to provide opportunities for spiritually nourishing social justice work in line with our UU values. We collaborate with other Unitarian Universalists and

social justice organizations (faith-based and secular) to promote social, economic and environmental justice in our local and global communities. Operating Guidelines Here.

Recent Development: Social Action is in the first year of their "reboot" under Rev. Ilene's leadership. In just one year, they have developed and implemented the Dignity Project, refined the process for annual selection of charitable giving recipient agencies, created a process for selection of Social Action programming (in cooperation with A.R.E.), and are about to launch a social justice leadership training chapter of Sacred Fire. Whew!

Over the last couple of years, the Facilities Team has accomplished, with Board assistance, a great number of deferred maintenance projects and facility improvements. This has included current inspections and other non-sexy work. With a much larger campus to now maintain, they are working with the Board and its Committees to try to make maintenance strategic: Asking for a capital needs assessment by outside professionals and strategic budgeting by the Finance Committee to

accumulate funds necessary to support a strategic maintenance plan. Such an assessment would determine the life of a roof, or an HVAC system, for example, and their replacement costs, so that a plan for what will need to be spent when can be set aside as an annual contribution to a capital fund to avoid a "fund drive" when that building system fails. Current greatest need? People to help pull weeds after all this rain!

Based on available resources, the Team can make informed decisions about not only whether programming aligns with their Function and UUTC's Mission, but whether the building and personnel can be set up to support the programming.

These small groups of people created by programming opportunities are vital to our Mission in that it is in small groups we participate and grow. Large groups let us sit back and be part, but not necessarily to be challenged. This is where programming supported by ARE is so valuable—leaders of small groups will make sure your voice is heard!

An increasing need for ARE is people who are trained on the AV system to support programming. This can range from everything as simple as setting up the hearing assistance microphone in a group or running a PowerPoint in the sanctuary.
