SOCIAL ACTION AGENCY FOR AUGUST — EL CENTRO: FINAL SUNDAY!


This year we added a new agency to UUTC — El Centro Comunitario Hispano-Americano of Transylvania County.

WAKE NOW OUR VISION COLLABORATIVE CAMPAIGN Legacy Challenge

WAKE NOW OUR VISION LEGACY CHALLENGE MAGNIFY YOUR GIVING

Wake Now Our Vision Legacy Challenge is designed to encourage new *legacy* giving. A legacy gift is a gift of cash, securities or other property that is realized after you die through a beneficiary designation or your will. New legacy

gift intentions made between January 1, 2017 to June 30, 2020 will qualify for a matching program as long as matching funds remain. If the receiving institution is unaware of an earlier intention, it will still qualify as new. The matching amount is 10% up to \$10,000 and the match comes from the Shelter Rock Congregation. In other words, a gift up to \$100,000 dollars will be matched by a gift from Shelter Rock in the amount of \$10,000. A \$1000 gift will be matched by a gift in the amount of \$100. If or if the gift cannot be accurately valued at this time, a flat match of \$1,000 will be given. Charitable Gift Annuities will count for this flat match. Four Members of UUTC have already qualified their gifts to this campaign. Why not join them in making an impact?


UUA groups that qualify for these matching gifts are <u>Church of the Larger Fellowship</u>, Starr King School for the Ministry, UU Minister's Association, Meadville Lombard Theological School, the UUA, <u>UUSC</u>, <u>The Mountain Retreat & Learning Center</u>, **and qualified UU Congregations such as UUTC**.

If your gift to UUTC is listed as a percentage of your assets, then Shelter Rock will provide a flat match of \$1000. However, unlike your legacy gift, the contributions from Shelter Rock will begin paying out in summer of 2019 to your selected groups. Don't miss this chance to amplify your giving. THE SHARED PULPIT — NEW CLASS FORMING

The Shared Pulpit, based on the book of the same name, is a complete workshop to help lay people gain experience writing and preaching (if they choose!) a full-length sermon for their congregation. TRAINING FOR OWL FACILITATORS: TWO OPPORTUNITIES!

Working with our youth and providing honest answers to their questions is enriching both for them and for us. Our Whole Lives (OWL) programming is so greatly valued that the United Church of Christ is now using the curriculum, as well. New leaders are always needed, so that

individual schedules can be honored... but our children continue to be served.

"Honest, accurate information about sexuality changes lives. It dismantles stereotypes and assumptions, builds self-acceptance and self-esteem, fosters healthy relationships, improves decision making, and has the potential to save liaves.... Our Whole Lives helps participants make informed and responsible decisions about their sexual health and behavior. With a holistic approach, Our Whole Lives provides, accurate, developmentally appropriate information about a range of topics, including relationships, gender identity, sexual orientation, sexual health, and cultural influences on sexuality." —-UUA.org

The **first opportunity** is **Friday through Sunday**, **Sept 21st-23rd**, **in Charlotte**, **NC**. Early bird cost (before August 31st) is \$275, \$300 after that date. Deadline for registration is September 12th. Contact Event Registrar Kathleen Carpenter via <u>email</u> or by calling 704-366-8623. Training for both K-6 and 7-12 is being offered. This is 2.5 hours from Brevard.

The **second opportunity** is also for all grades, but is iOctober 12th through the 14th. The deadline for registration is September 15th. This training is being held at Holston Valley UU, less than 2 hours away in Johnson City, TN. To register for this training, visit their website, click on the Learning tab at the top of the home page, and select either the K-6 or the 7-12 training from that menu. Home Hospitality is available at both sites, but will fill up quickly. Registration fees cover instruction and meals at either site, but trainees need to bring their own books.
