*James Mack*

*One man's journey from the Southern Baptist Church to self-realization and happiness.*

James Mack was born in Memphis, Tennessee, and raised Southern Baptist. In high school, he was president of the Bible Club. He went to a Southern Baptist University to become a preacher, but when he came out in his early 20's, he moved to New York City and began a career in men's fashion. Several years later he moved to Cape Cod, opened a bed and breakfast and discovered Unitarian Universalism. He met his future husband, Jon Arterton, in the UU choir there, and the two have been singing together ever since. For a decade he served as a chaplain with the UU Meeting House of Provincetown, performing weddings and commitment ceremonies. He and his husband now divide their time between St. Petersburg, Florida, and Brevard.

## PROGRAM ORGANIZER NEEDED

For several years, UUTC has participated, along with other churches in the community, in the CWS (Church World Services) CROP Walk to help raise funds to assist



communities in about 70 countries worldwide. Funds are used to address root causes of hunger and deal with disaster relief and recovery needs. 25% of the money raised goes to **our local Sharing House**, which is a giant blessing according to Shelly Webb, Director of Sharing House: "We are fortunate to have a community who cares deeply for the well-being of all. It is hard living in Transylvania County with low-wage and seasonal jobs and less than reliable transportation. Winter months are unpredictable for living expenses. It is not unusual for our neighbors to wait until it is absolutely necessary to ask for help when the oil tank is low, the pantry is bare, or the electricity is about to be cut off."

We rejoice in the good news that Reverend Ilene's surgery proceeded as expected. Recovery never goes as rapidly as one hopes, but we can hold her and her family close in our hearts on this part of her journey to wellness.



This Sunday's service (June 9th) will celebrate the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the founding of UUTC and recognize with much appreciation those among us who were present and played key roles in that auspicious moment. Look forward to a joyful occasion.

Turning to the next steps for UUTC (most of which will occur under the able leadership of Joyce Henneberry), the Board, at its specially called meeting scheduled for next Tuesday, will consider the various options available to fill the role of Minister to UUTC.

We are too late, in the UUA schedule, to use UUA's process to locate an Interim Minister to arrive this August. We are informed by the UUA Transitions group that the route to follow is the location of a contract minister. The contract process can proceed locally, but we have contacted UUA for their guidance and assistance. We understand that a contract minister can be called as a settled minister.

I hope that the Board chooses, as well, to enter into the UUA Search Process in a manner that will result in the Identification of a Settled Minister to arrive in August 2020. UUA Transitions Team will have to agree to this in order that we achieve this goal.

If the Board agrees to this dual track approach, then you will be hearing from the Advisory Council, consistent with the Organizational Structure, the document guiding our organizational activities. #### **PROCEDURES FOR ELECTING THE SETTLED MINISTER SEARCH TASK FORCE**

*... Six weeks prior to the Congregational Meeting to select a slate, the Council shall, through the newsletter, mailings, the Sunday bulletin, and/or speaking during Sunday service, call for names of Members to be submitted from the Congregation, either one's own or someone else's. This call will be made for two weeks." If you are interested in serving on this Task Force, please let any Board Member know. We will pass this information on to the Council for consideration.*

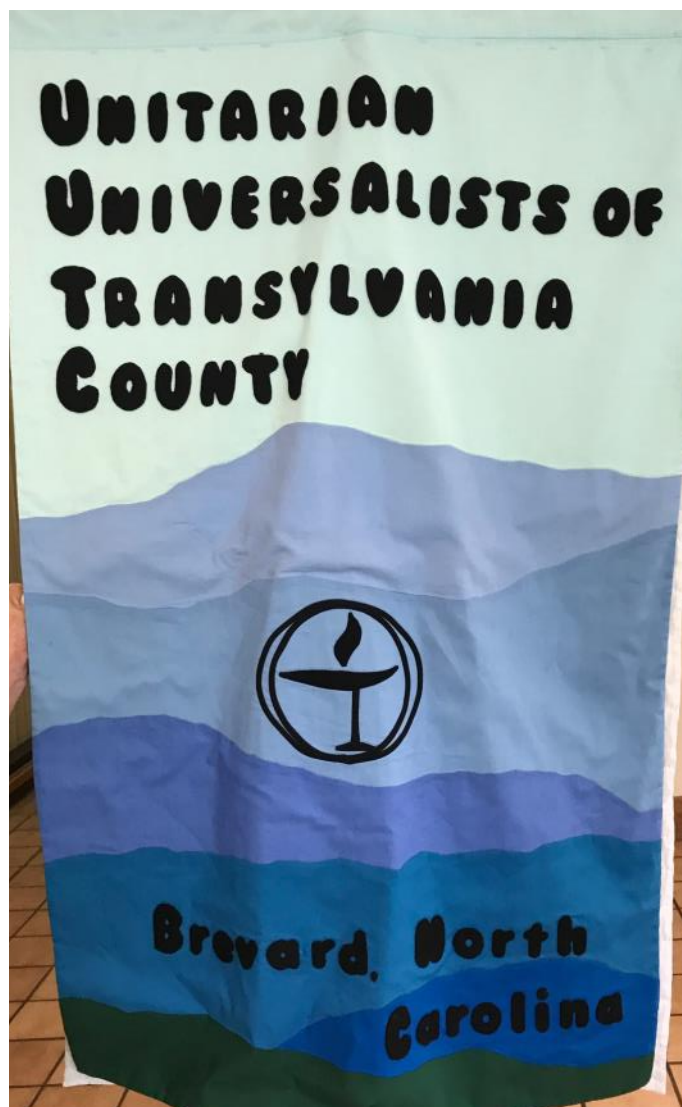
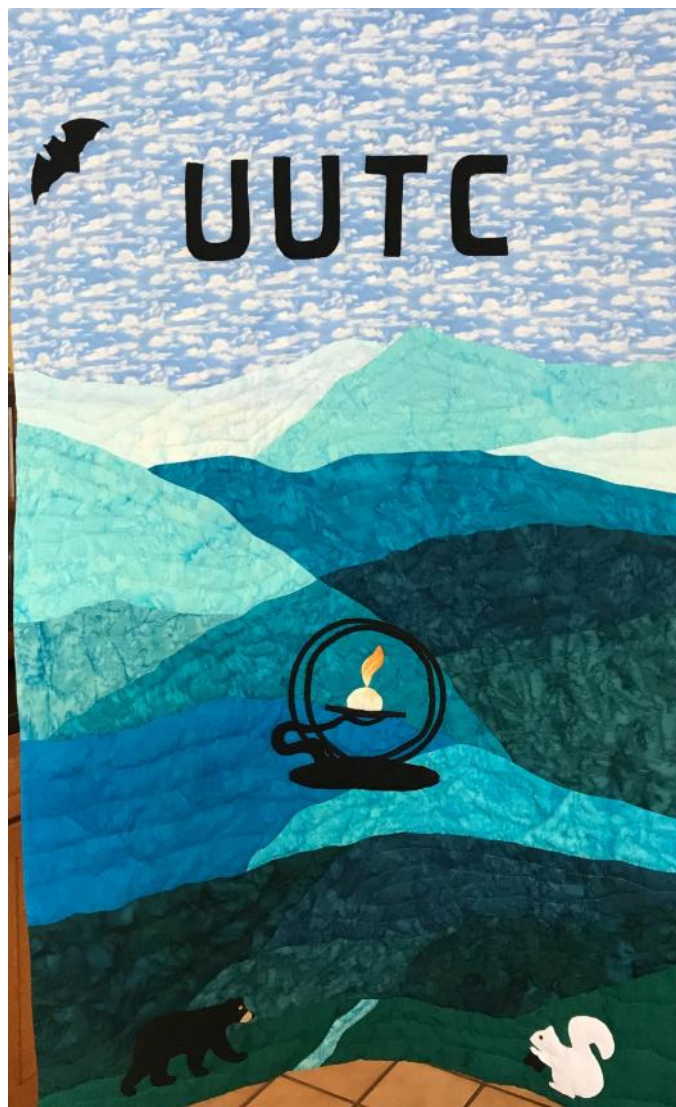

Part of what makes the banner so rich is the use of batik dyed fabrics in the mountains. The visual texture of this fabric makes the mountains feel as rich as the forests that cover them.
