Homeless: A Look Inside

She joined the staff in January 2012. Starting in administration and making her way up to the role of Executive Director "has been humbling," she states. "To know where I've come from and where I'm at now is only through a Power greater than me."

PROGRAM ORGANIZER NEEDED

For several years, UUTC has participated, along with other churches in the community, in the CWS (Church World Services) CROP Walk to help raise funds to assist communities in about 70 countries worldwide. Funds are used to address root causes of hunger and deal with disaster relief and recovery needs. 25% of the money raised goes to **our local Sharing House**, which is a giant blessing according to Shelly Webb, Director of Sharing House: "We are fortunate to have a community who cares deeply for the well-being of all. It is hard living in Transylvania County with low-wage and seasonal jobs and less than reliable transportation. Winter months are unpredictable for living expenses. It is not unusual for our neighbors to wait until it is absolutely necessary to ask for help when the oil tank is low, the pantry is bare, or the electricity is about to be cut off."

UUTC is in need of an organizer of volunteers for this fall's walk of 3.1 miles on Sunday, October 13. Local experts are available to help with details. Please contact Sue Null suenull@rice.edu, 828-877-2550.



LOOK WHO'S COOKING!



The Bread of Life is a community food kitchen that serves an average of 160 lunches a day, five days a week (and on Sunday in the winter), 52 weeks a year, for a grand total of approximately 42,000 lunches a year. These lunches are provided, no questions asked, to anyone who walks in the door of the Bread of Life, and people are allowed to eat in the dining room or carry lunches out (or both).

With the exception of one part-time person (Michael Collins, who manages the entire operation), all “employees” are volunteers, and money and food donations provide its only funding. It is an incredible organization that UUTC supports financially and now supports through group volunteering on a regular basis.

The Social Action team is seeking to build personal relationships with the organizations UUTC supports financially, so it has committed to **supplying a crew of volunteers to the Bread of Life every 5th Thursday** for months that have one **(only four or five occasions per year)**. Members of the team have already volunteered as a group there twice, and we would now like to open up this opportunity to the rest of the UUTC community so that others may also have this experience.

The only skills needed to be a volunteer are a good attitude and knowing how to chop fruit and vegetables, serve food, and/or wash dishes. **There are two more 5th Thursdays this year: August 29 and October 31.** Volunteers work from 9:00AM to approximately 1:00PM, but there can also be 9:00-11:00 and 11:00-1:00 shifts if enough people are interested.

Believe it or not, it is also possible to have too many volunteers, so the available slots will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Please contact the team through email (socialjustice@uutc.org) to let us know if you are interested in volunteering on one of these dates. We'd love to see you cooking there, too!



GETTING CONNECTED

Contact Directories are really important for us all to stay connected. But did you know that the *ChurchLife* app is available to Members and Friends free of charge? It is easy to use and is the most up-to-date resource for reaching other members of UUTC.

You can download and install the app from either Google Play or the Apple App Store. **Before you can use it, however, you will need a password from our ACS database.**



To get that password, go to our Member page on the website: <http://uutc.org/member/>, scroll down to the red "ACS" logo and click on it. It will direct you to the ACS login/get a password page. On that page, **look below the login** box for "**Need a Login? Click Here,**" and enter your email there. This will connect you to ACS and they will email you with a way to select a password to use with the *ChurchLife* app.

Sometimes this email ends up in your spam folder. If you have any trouble getting your password, come in to see RK and we'll get you set up properly. Be sure to bring all your OTHER passwords with you (email, Apple Id, etc), so we can complete the installation process.

If you successfully receive the email from UUTC that allows you to set a password, terrific! Follow the link (which will open your web browser), set up a password—right that down—and then close the browser. This is a little confusing because the browser will have UUTC and ACS all over it, but this is NOT the tidy little ChurchLife app, but the full-on database.

Now return to the ChurchLife app you previously downloaded. Use your email and your new password and login. Presto! Your church directory is in your pocket!

IF YOU DO NOT HAVE A SMARTPHONE: Drop by the office and request a printed copy of the contact directory, available to Members and Friends. While it has no images, it will give you current information for all the lovely people in our UUTC family.
