
One of our forebears, Louisa May Alcott was a Unitarian Transcendentalist, part of a vibrant group of American intellectuals living in and around Concord, Massachusetts in the mid-1800s. Through her published works, she has shaped the spiritual and ethical values of American women up to the present day. Her semi-autobiographical novel Little Women, adapted for film most recently by director Greta Gerwig in a movie released in December 2019, continues to influence both literary and popular culture.

Our opening speaker is Dr. Jackson P. Rainer, a renowned Doctor of psychology with extensive speaking experience on grief, caregiver fatigue, and spiritual responses to these end of life events. He is the author of *Life After Loss: Contemporary Grief Counseling & Therapy,* and *Isolated and Alone: Therapeutic Interventions for Loneliness* and other titles. Dr. Rainer's chosen areas of research include grief and bereavement, end-of-life care, quality of life enhancement, rural mental health, and psychotherapy processes.

Dr. Morris Jenkins will speak on February 6th on hospice care and end of life decisions on medical care. Jim Null will speak on February 13th on end of life financial choices. Rev. shore and a panel will speak on February 20th on grief and memorial services. The program for the final session on February 27th is not yet confirmed, but in the works. 
A TREATISE OF HUMAN NATURE by David Hume

- IS IT PARTNERING WITH OTHERS?
- IS IT A WELL RUN ORGANIZATION WITH A REACH BEYOND BREVARD?
- DO WE HAVE A RELATIONSHIP WITH THE ORGANIZATION, OR ARE WE TRYING TO BUILD ONE?
- WHAT ARE THEIR FINANCES AND HOW DO THEY GENERATE MONEY?
- DO THEY REALLY NEED US?

UPDATE FROM THE MINISTERIAL SEARCH COMMITTEE

Since the new year began, Search Committee members have been busy interviewing potential candidates.

The whole search progress began when the committee submitted a congregational profile for candidates to review; this was done in December. On January 2, the Search Committee received the list of candidates who expressed interest in UUTC.

Within a short time, members read and discussed each minister's application then ranked our top candidates. We arranged for an hour-long video meeting with each, asking detailed questions and answering their questions. From those interviews, we selected the top three candidates. In February and March, the committee will



meet with each one for personal interviews. The committee will also hear each candidate give a sermon at a neutral location.

When all the visits are done, we will rank these candidates on who we feel would fit best at UUTC. At the same time, candidates will rank their favored congregations. When we arrive at a match, UUTC will extend an offer to a candidate and invite this person to visit the church for Candidating Week (April 26-May 3). During this time, members and friends will hear the final candidate deliver two Sunday sermons and will have several opportunities to interact with our prospective new minister. On the final day of Candidating Week, Members of the congregation will vote to accept or reject this candidate to serve as our settled minister.
