Unitarian Universalist Theology: A Primer in Story & Song

Unitarian Universalism sometimes calls itself "a creedless faith" -- referring to the fact that we do not require a profession of belief. Does that mean we don't have a theology-- shared beliefs about God, Life, the Universe, and Everything? Today I invite you to consider 5 possible axioms of Unitarian Universalist theology, as illustrated by stories and music from our history.



Three new books by Unitarian Universalist authors are now available in your UUTC Library. They are shelved alphabetically by author in the library's Unitarian Universalist section.




WILLIAM ELLERY CHANNING: HIS RELIGIOUS AND SOCIAL THOUGHT by Anne Holt

This little book captures the profound wisdom of this early proponent of Unitarianism and his belief in the spiritual nature of humanity, and its kinship with the divine.

UNDERSTANDING THE BIBLE by John A. Buehrens

Written by a Unitarian Universalist minister, this book is an introduction to the Bible for skeptics, seekers, and religious liberals. He invites the reader to rediscover our culture's central religious and spiritual text and makes accessible some of the best contemporary historical, literary, political, and feminist readings of the Hebrew and Christian scriptures.



AMERICAN FASCISM AND GOD by Davidson Loehr

This book by a Unitarian Universalist minister offers plain talk on what is happening on politics and religion in America, He reviews religion's special mission in American history and heralds the return of religion to its rightful place in the moral high ground of our national politics.


This Sunday is the last day to sign up—join the 14 others who will be attending!



JOIN A PILGRIMAGE TO MONTGOMERY, AL — FEBRUARY 7TH DEADLINE TO REGISTER

Join a Brevard group heading to Alabama to see the Equal Justice initiative (EJI) Legacy Museum and the National Memorial for Peace and Justice (also known as the National Lynching Memorial). Near a heavily used slave auction and a dock and rail station where tens of thousands of black people were

trafficked during the 19th century, the museum dramatizes the enslavement of African Americans, the evolution of racial terror lynchings, and legalized racial segregation in America. Modeled on memorials in other countries designed to highlight histories of genocide, apartheid, and horrific human rights abuses, the memorial contains over 800 steel monuments, one for each county in the united states where a racial terror lynching took place. The names of the lynching victims are engraved on the columns.



This pilgrimage aims to bring us a more personal and deeper understanding of how our nation's treatment of different races influences us today, and how we as individuals and as residents of Transylvania county may create a more just community.

Pilgrimage itinerary: trip dates are Thursday, October 22- Saturday, October 24. Details and costs will be available once we know the approximate number of pilgrims.
